THE WOODFORD LODGE 1919

The original minute book of "The Woodford Lodge" opens with an historical note, it is in the handwriting of the first secretary W.Bro. John Trevelyan Miller, and it begins thus:

The idea of establishing a Woodford Lodge was first discussed at the Anti-Aircraft station in Buckhurst Hill during early 1918 by Bros.

W.B.Ritchie, J.T.Miller, E.Heckford and F.W.Hughes.

(The 4 founding members)

By them vigil was kept from the summit of the tower, and by co-ordinating reports from this and other stations, the route of approaching aircraft was traced by Defence Headquarters.

As the Kaisers war approached its end, and hope grew that the World would not again be put to the same agony, it was perhaps hope and longing that engendered the thought of a new lodge dedicated to:

Brotherly Love, Relief & Truth!

In the beginning the design was essentially to make it a <u>Lodge of Special Constables</u> who had been involved with police duties during the Great War.

The Anti-Aircraft station mentioned was at "St James's Congregational Church" in Palmerstone Road, Buckhurst Hill which was manned by squads of Special Constables, who were drawn in from, Woodford, Loughton and Buckhurst Hill.

It is commemorated in the crest of the lodge which appears on the on each Summons, Banner, depicting the square pinnacled tower of the Congregational Church

The original plan for a Lodge of Special Constables_was soon extended, and the historical note continues:

Inquiries and circumstances led to a wider conception, and it was decided to hold the meetings in the <u>City of London</u> because there was a tendency for members to introduce friends who lived in other parts of the metropolis.

There where then further modifications proposed, and when the 1st formal meeting of intended founders was held on the 8th of July 1918, their number had grown to 8. Then on the 18th of October 1918 when a petition to the MWGM to grant a warrant was made the number of founders had grown to 15

(The MWGM in due course gave his decision to grant a warrant)

It was then added that 4 of the proposed founders were removed from the petition on the ground that they were less than 3 years standing a MM.

Among these members was "Bro.FW Hughe"s who was among the original four whose conversations had led to the creation of the lodge.

(Bro FW Hughes became the 1st joining member of the lodge)

W.Bro W.A Hudson LR was invited to become the first Worshipful Master of a lodge of past and present residents of **Woodford** and the immediate area.

The solemn ceremony of consecration took place in the **Grecian Temple** at the "Abercorn" rooms, Bishopsgate, on the **14th of February 1919.**

Distinguished guests, were five in total, two of whom were Grand Officers from America who had journeyed across Europe on a Masonic mission and they were invited to witness the consecration under the United Grand Lodge of England.

They were:

Judge Townsend Scudder, Past Grand Master of New York

Bro William C. Prime, representative of the Grand Lodge of England near the Grand Lodge of New York

Bro T Channing Moore Commissioner of Appeals,

Bro. Geo S Goodrich, P.D.D.G.M. of New York

& Bro Merwin W. Lay. G.Rep D of C New York

Judge Scudder who spoke when the brethren were at refreshment, dwelt upon the great potentialities for good in the world that lie in "Freemasonry" and the masonic spirit, and the peculiar opportunities that exist at the present moment for the exercise by **Freemasonry** of increased benevolence to mankind.
